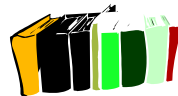

Breeds will be; Cross (Full Count boar-Zena sow & Black Dice boar and Menck sow) Yorkshire (Full County boar, Menck sow), Duroc (Jimmy Dean boar, Madona sow) and Hampshire (Black Dice boar, Godzilla sow at 3/4 cross).
